The Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has provided emergency grants to those North Carolina districts affected by the hurricane.


Foundation Chairperson Sid L. Scruggs III and State Council Chairperson Carlton Weeks toured the affected areas in District 31-H and District 31-J as clean-up was underway. Each District received two emergency grants of \$10,000 for immediate help to the victims of the hurricanes.

The grant money was used to provide food, water, clothing, blankets, medicine and medical supplies, cleaning supplies and toiletries.

The two VDG's and myself have been busy this year visiting clubs. A total of 50 visits have been made by the three of us. I have made regular visits to some of the clubs that a VDG represented me for the official Governors visit. My goal is to visit all the clubs even though some had an official visit by a VDG. There are a total of twelve visits left to complete all official and unofficial visits. For the three of us this has been a very rewarding experience. # HUMANITARIAN WHITE CANE PROGRAM

This month I would like to talk about the White Cane Program. The Humanitarian White Cane Drive is the largest source of revenue for the North Carolina Lions, Inc. comprising approximately 50% of

the budgeted revenues. The first organized White Can Drive was held during the 1946-1947 Lions year. This drive netted \$13, 451 to carry out the much needed program of the NC State Association for the Blind. Last year the total amount collected for the White Cane Drive amounted to more than \$742,642. During the April budget hearing the incoming District governors set the goals for the Humanitarian white Cane Drive. In our Lion's District 31F, each club is asked to contribute \$84 per member to the White Cane program.

The money collected for the White Cane Drive is used for many different programs sponsored by the NC Lions. Below are ways the money was used to help the blind and visually impaired people in North Carolina.

- If you see someone using a white cane it was provided by the Lions. In 2009 there were 1,279 canes given to the visually impaired at a cost of \$52,278
- 149,233 pairs of eyeglasses were recycled providing improved vision to thousands of individuals.
- 14,104 individuals were screened with the Vision Van at a cost of \$165,864
- Over 689 campers attended Camp Dogwood for a week at at cost of \$465,075.
- 17 sighted children of visually impaired parents received Educational Grants at a cost of \$45,887.
- Over 1,255 eye exams were provided through Matching Funds at a cost of \$150,959.
- 2,121 pairs of eyeglasses were purchased through Matching Funds at a cost of \$204,854.
- 19 miscellaneous requests for assistance were provided through Matching Funds at a cost of \$16,747.Fishing Tournament and the Deaf/Blind Retreat.

As you can see the White Cane Drive is a worthwhile endeavor that provides much needed assistance to many of the blind and visually impaired people in North Carolina. Please do what you can within your club to meet the Governor's goal.
